



# PACMAN FROG CARE SHEET

## UNBOXING

1. Do NOT feed your frog immediately, Allow at least 24 hours for acclimation.
2. Always unbox indoors and allow the frog to warm gradually to room temperature.
3. Provide a hide so the frog can settle and feel secure.

**Cannibalism warning:** Never house different sizes together. PacMan frogs will eat each other when given the opportunity.

## FEEDING

1. Every frog differs in metabolism and growth rate, When in doubt, feed smaller portions more frequently.
2. Food items should generally be no larger than 1/3 of the frog's width.
3. Frogs digest faster in warm temperatures: cooler temps slow appetite and digestion

## FEEDER OPTIONS

- Earthworms
- Crickets, dubia roaches, red runners
- Silkworms. hornworms
- Occasional thawed or live pinkies
- Small freshwater fish (guppies, mollies)
- Avoid feeders high in Thiaminase (e.g, certain fish)



## ENCLOSURE /HUSBANDRY

### 1. Breeder Housing:

- Individual tubs or bins (16-52 qt. depending on frog size)
- Easy-to-clean surfaces
- Moderate ventilation

### 2. Humidity:

- 60-80%. depending on morph

### 3. Temperature:

- 75-84°F daytime
- 70-75°F nighttime



## FEEDING

Juveniles: every 2-3 days

Adults, every 5-6 days

(Breeders may adjust schedules based on growth goals and morph behavior)

## MORPH & MUTANT NOTES

- Monitor growth weekly; adjust feeding accordingly
- Track feeding, sheds, weight, and morph color development
- Remove uneaten food promptly
- Provide feeder variety for balanced nutrition
- Maintain strict quarantine for all new arrivals (60-80 days)
